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Canadian Haemophilia Outcomes – Kids’ Life Assessment Tool (CHO-KLAT)

Description

The Canadian Haemophilia Outcomes – Kids’ Life Assessment Tool (CHO-KLAT) v.3.0 is a 41-item haemophilia-specific health-related quality of life (HRQoL) questionnaire with a child report version (ages 7 to 18) and caregiver report version.

The CHO-KLAT was initially developed in 2004 when disease specific HRQoL measures were lacking, and the generic measures used did not usually focus on children’s perspectives. In 2008, linguistic translation and cognitive debriefing to develop versions of the CHO-KLAT in France, Germany, The Netherlands, Spain, and the United Kingdom led to slight modifications, resulting in the the CHO-KLAT version 2.0 (CHO-KLAT v2.0).

In a follow-up study, the relevance of the item content of the CHO-KLAT v2.0 was reviewed in the context of extended half-life clotting factor concentrates (EHL CFCs) and other emerging non-factor therapies. The CHO-KLAT v3.0 is a valid, reliable child-centric tool that is designed to measure HRQoL among boys with haemophilia and incorporates a subdomain scoring structure to facilitate assessment of concepts important to emerging therapies, such as burden of administration.
